

COVID 19 PREPAREDNESS PLAN for CHILD CARE PROGRAMS

Key Program Objectives

- To advise, educate and guide Child Care owners/management, staff and parents of critical factors used in developing an ongoing effective program of COVID 19 prevention.
- To develop a self-sustaining, site specific prevention plan in compliance with and exceeding current State and Federal agency guidelines. This will include critical HVAC modifications or air disinfectant systems that produce an ongoing, self-sustaining environment to effectively mitigate the transmission of COVID 19.
- Implementing an emergency C&D (clean and disinfect) plan should a case of COVID 19 infection occur within the institution with 2nd party project supervision and post testing.
- * To provide cost-effective ongoing oversight of the plan by a certified, experienced IEP to include critical updates, inspections and training as requested or needed. To provide second party validation of the plan as to compliance to all known and stated Guidelines for operation of a Child Care Program. A Certificate of Compliance will be provided.

Key Components

A. Risk Assessment

1. An initial visit and inspection of the facility will be made to assess the effectiveness of the current COVID preparedness and response measures being utilized.
2. A physical review of the building layout, HVAC and ventilation systems and environmental conditions that will affect the implementation and ongoing sustainability of the program.

B. Standards Compliancy

1. The development of an overall plan that includes the CDC Coronavirus Disease 2019 Guidance for Child Care, ASHRAE chapter 62 standards, OSHA safety standards and use and application of EPA approved disinfectant products.

C. Critical Information Flow

1. The approved plan and procedures would be documented to be used for training and new employee orientations. An initial meeting with all involved persons would be given for clarity prior to implementation. The approved plan can then be available to be distributed to parents and supporters of the Day Care as well as state agencies.
2. An ongoing flow of information will be provided by the Plan provider to include any State and Federal Guideline changes as well as any critical scientific or environmental documented studies or research that affect the plan.

D. Plan and Project Management

1. Supervisory services would be provided as needed to work with qualified Environmental and HVAC contractors to provide services not able to be implemented by the current staffing.

E. Environmental Consulting and Testing Services

1. Environmental surface testing for the RNA of SARS CoV1 and CoV2 would be provided by a CIH (Certified Industrial Hygienist) to investigate any possible infective conditions within the building or to validate the efficacy of an emergency clean and disinfect project.
